Be intentional and extend a personal invitation to a mom! Tell her what qualities you see in her that you believe would make her a good MomCo Leader. Meet with women in the church to see if they are interested in helping lead the group or know someone who would be interested.

Ask pastors' wives if they know moms who are faithful servants, but aren't currently engaged in leadership. Is there a mom who could be building her leadership skills or using her skills to lead a group?

- Look for someone who loves other women. Moms understand what other moms need because they are on that journey, too.
- Look to women who are already serving in women's and children's ministries. It's likely they have a heart for moms and kids and would be willing to lead.

REMEMBER —

It only takes one MomCo champion to start a group. If she has a heart for MomCo, others will follow her.

FINDING LEADERS *How to fill your leadership team*

- Pray that God brings the right women to your team.
- Announce open positions at your MomCo Meetups.
- Identify potential leaders, point out their gifts and ask them to become a leader.
- Ask your church leadership if they have suggestions for potential leaders.
- _ Host a MomCo informational meeting.
- Get the word out about your group and you'll naturally attract leaders. Publicize in the bulletin or send flyers home in backpacks if your have a preschool on campus. Make announcements at Sunday services, at a women's Bible study or VBS — anywhere moms already are.
